The teams compete in the Eastern Indiana Academic League, as well as in regional and state events. There are six meets in our season.

One purpose of academic competition is to recognize student academic achievements.

Centerville Senior High School was the 1993 State Champion in Fine Arts Class 3 in the Ameritech Hoosier Academic Super Bowl.

ATHLETICS

The athletic program is under the direction of the IHSAA and local school athletic code of ethics.

The Centerville Senior High School athletic program consists of the following sports: boys and girls cross-country, swimming, tennis, basketball, track, soccer, golf, bowling; boys wrestling, football, baseball; girls softball and volleyball and cheerleading.

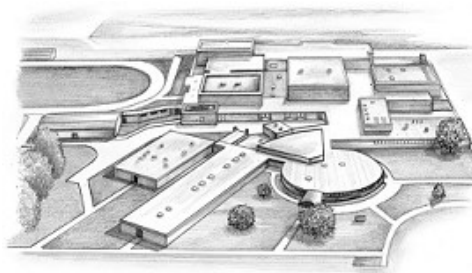

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CENTERVILLE YESTERDAY...

Centerville was platted in 1814, on land that once belonged to the Miami Indians and was settled by Quakers from Carolina and Virginia. In 1828, the National Road, our Main Street, was surveyed and later became the first improved section of the trail in 1850 by a special act of the U.S. Congress.

Centerville's cobblestone street was a major stop along the trail to the west. During the height of the Gold Rush, 49,000 wagons would travel along our street each year. As a result, our businesses boomed and our leaders became influential across the entire country. The following people are a sampling of what Centerville had to offer in the 1800's: John Harvey, governor of North Dakota Territory; John Burbank, governor of Kansas, Joe Kibbey, governor of Arizona Territory, General Lew Wallace, governor of New Mexico Territory, U.S. Congressman George Julian was the Great Abolitionist, Governor Oliver P. Morton was the most influential Union supporter behind Lincoln during the Civil War.

THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

The Centerville-Abington Community School Corporation is located west of Richmond in Wayne County. The corporation includes three distinct areas: (1) the towns of Centerville and Abington, (2) the rural area and (3) the suburbs of Richmond. The town of Centerville is located 3 miles west of Richmond, and just a short distance from several larger cities. The population, as a whole, is an above average socio-economic group, and the students tend to be above average in ability and achievement.

STATE OF THE ART FACILITIES

Centerville Senior High School is a public four-year high school with an enrollment of 488 students grades 9-12. The building was built in 1961 with additions added in 1976 and 1981. In 1994, the building was remodeled and up-dated. During the 2001-2002 school year, four new science rooms, a wellness center, and air conditioning were added. The structure includes 36 classrooms, a family and consumer science area, a guidance area, 2 gymnasiums, a pool, an auditorium, 2 music areas, 1 computer lab, a library, a wellness center, a kitchen and a cafeteria. All grade levels (K-12) use the music areas, the pool and the auditorium.

ACCREDITATION

Centerville Senior High School has been a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools since 1967. Centerville-Abington Community Schools was awarded the NCA CASI AdvancED District Accreditation in 2012. The district has been granted a five-year term of accreditation.

EXCEPTIONAL FACULTY

Many of our faculty have been honored for excellence. In recent years, members of our staff have been awarded as the semi-finalists for Indiana Teacher of the Year, Ball State Outstanding Alumnus award, and local agency and organization awards. Several of our staff members have taught for Indiana University East and Earlham College. Members of our staff have held offices and participated in many professional organizations.

STRONG ACADEMICS

Centerville Senior High School is large enough to offer a wide-range of academic programs and yet is small enough to work with students on an individual basis. We offer eight advanced placement courses in English, Biology, Chemistry, Calculus, and Studio Art and six honors courses in English, U.S. and World Histories, Geometry and Algebra II, and a variety of courses for college preparation. Technical programs are also available that give students training through the Whitewater Career Center (WCC) such as cosmetology, health care, automotive, electrical, and computers.

EIGHT-BLOCK SCHEDULE

In the fall of 1995, Centerville Senior High School implemented the eight-block schedule. This schedule consists of four 90-minute periods each day, which alternates over a two-week period. This schedule was implemented in order to: (1) allow for students to earn a minimum of seven credits a semester (2) provide more time for students to organize and prepare for fewer daily classes (3) provide longer time for teaching without interruptions (4) allow more efficient use of time by reducing the number of passing periods (5) allow students to meet Core 40 and Academic Honors or Technical Honors Diploma requirements and still have room in their schedule for elective classes. Additional opportunities for students to receive credit is provided through the Bulldog Opportunity Academy.
